

FAQs: Italy Car Insurance for FAO & UN Staff

Car insurance in Italy can be complex, especially when moving from another country. Our insurance options are specifically created for FAO and UN staff, helping you secure the right coverage with better value and fewer limitations than many local insurers.

Can I use my no-claims bonus from another country?

Yes. We recognize your full no-claims history from abroad, helping many FAO and UN staff access significantly lower premiums from the start. Many local insurers do not fully recognize international driving history; this is one of the key ways we help reduce your cost.

Can I insure a foreign-registered vehicle in Italy?

Yes. Coverage is available for non-EU/EEC registered vehicles for up to 135 days with proof of Italian residency. After this period, the vehicle must be registered with Italian plates to continue coverage.

Do I need an Italian driver's license or international permit?

No. As long as you hold a valid driving license, we can offer Italian car insurance. An international driver's permit may be required for driving and should be obtained before arrival if applicable.

Is roadside assistance available outside Italy?

Yes, roadside assistance is available 24/7 both inside and outside of Italy, across Green Card territories.

Are diplomatic and civil plates covered?

Yes. Coverage is available for civil and diplomatic plates, designed specifically for internationally mobile professionals.

How does the 'No Claims Bonus' system work in Italy?

Italy uses a Bonus/Malus system, where drivers are assigned a class (from 14 to 1) based on their claims history. Without recognized history, drivers typically start at a higher (more expensive) class. By accepting your no-claims record from abroad, we help position you more favorably from day one.

Can I drive outside of Italy with my insurance?

Yes. Travel within the EU, Schengen Area, and the UK is included with Third-Party Liability coverage, with a Green Card provided.

What is Green Card insurance? Can I extend my coverage outside Italy?

A Green Card (Carta Verde) allows you to drive across EU and Schengen countries with the same level of coverage as in Italy. If your policy includes Third-Party Liability, this coverage is automatically extended across these regions, so you can travel without arranging separate policies.

What if I have dual citizenship?

Dual citizenship does not affect your eligibility. We can provide coverage regardless of your nationality.
